#### PORT LOCATION

The Port of Helsinki has three areas for cruise ships to dock. LHB, LHC, LHD are at Hernesaari Quays, ERA, EKL are at Kataianokka Quays, and EPL, EMA are at South Harbour Quays. Find your berth here.

**Getting Around:** From the cruise terminal, public transport, taxis, or a (typically chargeable) cruise shuttle takes you into the city centre (drop off: near Market Sq, 4km from port). To walk from the port to city centre takes about 40-minutes. Once in town, walking around is enjoyable. The public transport system is efficient, and tickets can be purchased via the HSL smartphone app (Apple | Android). Tickets are cheaper before you board. To For public transport maps click here

Taxis: Taxis are available and can be hailed on the street. Base rate €5.50. Most take cash and card payment.

Tourist Bus: There is a Hop-On-Hop-Off Sightseeing Bus (19 stops | €34 | Stop 7: cruise port | map)

Tuomiokirkko (Helsinki Cathedral): Green-domed, neoclassical cathedral dominates the city skyline. 9a-11:45a, 12:30p-6p (Mon-Fri), 1p-6p (Sat), 11:30a-6p (Sun) | €5 | 4km from port (17-min drive) | 🚱 | 👚

Temppeliaukio Church: Lutheran church, carved directly into solid rock. Architectural marvel and popular as a concert venue too. Open daily (hours vary) | €8 | 4km from port (14-min drive) | 🚱 | 👚

Uspenski Cathedral: The focal point of the Finnish Orthodox faith, ornate exterior and lavish interior. 9:30a-4p (Tue-Fri), 10a-3p (Sat), 12p-3p (Sun) | Free | 4.6km from port (15-min drive) | 🚱 | 👚

Ateneumin Taidemuseo: The main art museum, with the largest collection of classical art in the country. 10a-8p (Tue-Fri), 10a-5p (Sat, Sun) | €22 | 4km from port (14-min drive) | 🎙 | 👚

Hotel & Restaurant Museum: A museum of food and drink culture, at the Cable Factory cultural centre. 

Seurasaari Open-Air Museum: Seasonal museum spread over an entire island, with traditional Finnish houses, farmsteads and manors from different regions. 9a-3p (Mon-Fri), 11a-5p (Sat, Sun) | €12 | 8km from port (20-min drive) | 🏈 | 🖰

Tähtitorninvuori: Elegant urban park, laid out in 1868, with astronomy-themed displays in the former observatory. 24 Hours | Free | 2.8km from port (10-min drive) | 🌎 | 🖰

Market Square: A bustling area by the harbour with fresh Finnish produce, souvenirs, and crafts. 8a-6p (Mon-Sat) | Free | 4km from port (11-min drive) | 🚱 | 👚

#### REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Suomenlinna: Inhabited 18th Century sea fortress. UNESCO World Heritage Site. 4km from port (15-min ferry from Market Sq) | 🕎 | 🐣

Lohja: Known for its apple orchards, beautiful scenery and the Tytyri Mine Museum 強. 60km from port (1-hour drive) | ③

### SOMETHING TO EAT OR DRINK

Karjalanpiirakka (Karelian Pasty): A traditional pasty made with thin rye pastry and filled with rice. Popular since the 1900s. Read more

Runeberg-Törtchen: Torte flavoured with almonds and arrack or rum. Usually finished with raspberry jam and a ring of icing on the top. Originally from Porvoo, Finland. Read more

Salmiakki Koskenkorva: Pre-mixed liqueur, made with Koskenkorva Viina vodka with salmiakki extract dissolved into it for a salty liquorice flavour.

# LOCAL SOUVENIRS

The Finnish love their saunas, so items including towels, oils and other sauna-related gifts are popular. Also keep your eyes peeled for a **Kuksa** – traditional Sami drinking cup made from birch burl, or a **Puukko** - a traditional Finnish belt knife. Berries are popular and grow well here - particularly cloudberry and **buckthorn** - which are often used in jams, syrups and skincare products.
