# **WARNEMÜNDE, GERMANY**

A charming seaside town in the picturesque district of Rostock, known for its wide sandy beach, historic lighthouse, and the Alter Strom - a canal lined with fishing boats and seafood restaurants. Nearby, Rostock is the nearest small city, with a vibrant cultural scene. Berlin is 2.5-hours by train.

## PORT LOCATION

Ships dock 300m from the town centre. Follow signs to the City Centre as you leave the port, which will take you under the train tracks. The walk to town takes about 10-minutes.

Getting Around: The easiest way to enjoy the small town of Warnemunde is on foot. If heading further afield, Warnemünde Station is served by all three Rostock S-Bahn lines, as well as longdistance trains (including the Deutsche Bahn Intercity-Express train to Berlin, which departs every four hours). Purchase train tickets in advance online, or at the station.

Taxis: Taxis are available and can be hailed on the street. Most take cash and card payment.

Tourist Bus: There is no Hop-On-Hop-Off Sightseeing Bus in Warnemünde

Warnemünde Beach: On a sunny day, Warnemünde beach is a perfect spot for sunbathing and swimming in the Baltic Sea. 24 Hours | Free | 3.2km from port (25-min walk) | 🏈 | 🔏

Leuchtturm Warnemünde (Lighthouse): 19<sup>th</sup> Century lighthouse with wonderful views over the town and sea. Climb 31m (135 steps) to the top for the best views. 

Alter Strom: Historic canal, lined with fresh fish restaurants and good places to buy local souvenirs. 24 Hours | Free | 700m from port (10-min walk) | 🚱

Warnemunde Church: Neo-Gothic Protestant church with an interesting interior. 12p-6p | Free | 900m from port (13-min walk) | 🕎 | 🐴

Edvard-Munch-Haus: Famous for his disturbing painting The Scream, the famous painter Edvard Munch once lived in this house, now used for exhibitions.

#### REGIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Rostock: A short journey up the Warnow River, Rostock has a rich history and vibrant cultural scene. Home to **Rostocker Zoo** <u>1</u> (one of the largest in Europe), and a **Museum of Cultural History** <u>1</u>. 13.4km from port (17-min drive, 20-min train) | ③

Schwerin: The state capital of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, known for its neo-Renaissance palace -Schwerin Castle 👲. 97km from port (1-hour drive) | 🚱

Berlin: While not close, many cruise visitors use Warnemünde as a gateway to the German capital city. Best visited as part of an organised tour, given the journey times. Famous for the Berlin Wall and Brandenburg Gate. 230km from port (2.5-hour train)

#### SOMETHING TO EAT OR DRINK

Fischbrötchen: Fish sandwiches are a local favourite and can be enjoyed in the iconic Teepott Restaurant on the waterfront, next to the Lighthouse.

Bratwurst: As with much of Germany, Warnemünde locals love their sausages. In particular the Bratwurst, typically made from pork - though occasionally from beef or veal. From the Old High German brät (finely chopped meat) and wurst (sausage).

Beer: Germany is world-renowned for its love of beer... especially in October. There are plenty of places to enjoy a local brew along the Alter Strom canal promenade.

Fröhlich Frozen Yoghurt: Not exclusively German, but nice, nonetheless.

# LOCAL SOUVENIRS

In the Baltic region, amber jewellery is a popular souvenir - check out Warnemünder Schmuckeck for a tempting range of pieces.

Other popular souvenirs from Warnemünde include Sea Buckthorn products and maritime-themed items, like cups and pendants.
