## PORT LOCATION

Most cruise ships dock at the Ocean Quay terminals, which is about 4km from the centre of the city.

Getting Around: The easiest way to get to the city centre is via the cruise ship shuttle (some cruise lines charge). Alternatively, bus 25 can get you to town. Once in town, the public transport system of metro, S-trains, buses, and waterbuses provide ample options for exploring, in addition to walking. A 1hour ticket offers unlimited use of public transportation in the city zone for 24 DKK. Purchase tickets from ticket machines (available at port) or via the **DOT Mobilbilletter** app (Apple | Android)

Taxis: Taxis are available and take cash or card payment. Fares start at 24 DKK + 15.55 DKK/km 📰 💰 Tourist Bus: There is a <u>Hop-On Hop-Off Sightseeing Bus</u> (30 stops | €38 | take shuttle bus | 10a-5:40p)

Den Lille Havfrue: Statue honouring Hans Christian Andersen's character. Also see the Genetically Modified Little Mermaid sculpture nearby. 24 Hours | Free | 5.4km from port (12-min drive) | 🏈 | 👚

Kastellet: Overlooking the Little Mermaid, this star-shaped 17<sup>th</sup> Century fortress with ramparts and a museum is free to explore. 6a-8p | Free | 6km from port (15-min drive) | ③

Nyhavn: A bustling 17<sup>th</sup> Century canal, flanked by colourful townhouses, with historic ships, and (pricey) restaurants. 24 Hours | Free (... until you sit down) | 7km from port (20-min drive) | ③

Rosenborg Castle: Home to the Danish crown jewels, this Dutch Renaissance castle is surrounded by beautiful gardens. Tours available. 10a-5p | 140 DKK | 6.5km from port (15-min drive) | 🏈 | 🐴

Amalienborg Palace: 18th Century rococo palace complex. Tour the museums and watch the Changing of the Royal Guards at 12p. 10a-4p (Tue-Sun) | 125 DKK | 6.5km from port (15-min drive) | 🚱 | 🖞

SMK - Statens Museum for Kunst: Spectacular national art gallery, with internationally significant collection. 10a-6p (Tue-Sun), 10a-8p (Wed) | 130 DKK | 6km from port (15-min drive) | 🚱 | 🖄

Rundetaarn: Unusual 17th Century round tower with an observatory, planetarium and event space. Reach the top via a spiral ramp instead of stairs. 10a-8p | 40 DKK | 7km from port (20-min drive) | 🚱 | 🖄

Freetown Christiania: Technically in central Copenhagen, this bohemian neighbourhood has selfdeclared independence. Free-spirited and artsy. Known for the open sale of cannabis on Pusher Street (illegal in Denmark). Best to visit before sunset. 8km from port (20-min drive) | 24 Hours | Free | 🚱

Grundtvig's Church: A rare example of an expressionist church.

Frikadelle: Flat-bottomed meat balls, pan-fried.

Carlsberg or Tuborg Beer: Two of the most famous Danish beers come from right here in Copenhagen.
