PORT LOCATION

Most ships dock in the Ostseekai terminal. 1km from the centre of town. The train station is 1.8km from the port (5-min drive, 26-min walk). Check your ship's berth here.

Getting Around: Kiel is a walkable city, with many attractions close to each other. Public buses and ferries are operated by KVG, with single fares starting from around €2.50 and a day pass costing approximately €6. The main station **Kiel Hauptbahnhof** ♠ connects the city with other Northern Germany highlights, including Hamburg (Deutsche Bahn Intercity-Express | 1-hr 8-min train | €20-30) mww.kvg-kiel.de/en for more information

CENTRAL KIEL HIGHLIGHTS

Zoological Museum of Kiel University: 17th Century museum showcasing diverse zoological collections, including systematics, evolution, and marine life.

Kieler Schloss (Kiel Castle): Cultural centre housing three multi-purpose halls and a restaurant. The castle was completely destroyed in a 1944 bombing raid. Kieler Schifffahrtsmuseum Fischhalle & Museumsbrücke: Discover Kiel's maritime history in this former municipal fish hall, now filled with artefacts and models.

GREATER KIEL HIGHLIGHTS

Kiel Canal Aussichtsplattform Schleuse: Watch ships enter and exit the world-famous Kiel Canal, connecting the Baltic and North Seas. The canal cuts the journey between Skagerrak and Jutland by 250 nautical miles. 8a-10p | Free | 6.5km from port (15-min drive) | 🌎 | ტ

Flandernbunker: A World War II bunker transformed into a place of remembrance and learning.

University of Kiel Botanical Garden: A diverse range of plants, arranged in themed gardens. 9a-6p | Free | 4km from port (10-min drive) | 🚱 | 🖰

Naval Memorial: At the mouth of the Kiel Fjord, this 1936 memorial was originally erected to honour World War I sailors. There's a visitor centre, and an observation deck at the top of the tower. 9a-6p | €8 | 21km from port (35-min drive) | 🕎 | 👚

German Submarine U-995: In the shadow of the Naval Memorial, this WWII submarine has been converted into a technical museum. 9a-6p | €7 | 21km from port (35-min drive) | 🌎 | 🕆 🕆 🕆

SOMETHING TO EAT OR DRINK

Rote Grütze: Traditional Northern German dessert, made by cooking a variety of red berries with sugar and thickening with corn starch or potato starch. Typically served warm with custard or ice cream. More

Kieler Sprotte: A local smoked fish delicacy, typically smoked and packed in wooden boxes and available in both restaurants and markets.

Beer: Of course, Kiel has several local breweries to explore, including Kieler Brauerei (at Alter Markt 9), known for its traditional brewing methods. Lille Brauerei (Eichkamp 9c) is a smaller, more experimental option. For a wide range of local beers, check out Brewcomer, a beer store with great choices. (?)

LOCAL SOUVENIRS

Kiel has a long history as an important maritime trade hub. For that reason, many local stores specialise in maritime souvenirs and memorabilia, such as model ships and lighthouses, and other travel-related trinkets.
